Remembering Helen Kennedy Byron, Class of 1942

Helen Kennedy Byron died May 14, 2020, the last member of St. Joseph's class of 1942. A delightful person, with snow white hair and a contagious smile, Helen was all things St. Joseph's. She loved her family, her church, her community and her country.

Helen graduated during the early war years and, in 1944, enlisted in the Army Nurse Corps, serving in France. She was discharged in 1946, returned to Syracuse and worked at Syracuse General Hospital where she met, and later married, Francis Byron.

As is the case for most nurses, her life was a busy one. She worked part-time at St. Joseph's – first in ED, then with Kate Conroy on 2F. She was a mother to three, the neighborhood nurse and a prolific volunteer, continuing her volunteer services at Van Duyn and in the Diocesan Archives well into her retirement years.

But, of all the things Helen was, she was a St. Joseph's nurse. She was a thoughtful, caring, empathetic woman, a loyal friend who maintained her ties with her classmates and the school for the rest of her life. Helen attended the Alumni gatherings every year, including her 75th anniversary Alumni Brunch in 2017. For many, seeing Helen at these gatherings was a highlight of the day.

celebrating our graduates

St. Joseph's College of Nursing has graduated approximately 5,600 outstanding nurses since 1898. We are very proud that during a global pandemic, St. Joseph's College of Nursing graduated 222 students in 2020; 148 graduates from the evening/weekend option (67 from the Class of December 2019; 81 from the Class of December 2020) and 74 from the Class of May 2020 for the weekday option. The Associate Degree in Applied Science (A.A.S.) with a major in nursing was conferred on graduates in both options. Some graduates in the Accelerated Dual Degree Partnership in Nursing (A-DDPN) option also earned a Bachelor of Science degree from Le Moyne College. The Evening/Weekend Class of December 2019 commencement ceremony was held at the Landmark Theatre. Regina McGraw, JD, RN, General Counsel, St. Joseph's Health, delivered the commencement address for this class. Highlights of Ms. McGraw's visionary, *pre pandemic* commencement address on January 5, 2020 included a comparison of nurses to *superhero's* since 'nurses in the past wore capes.'

Due to the pandemic crisis and associated essential restrictions for safety put in place for large gatherings, two virtual commencement ceremonies were held for the Class of May 2020 and the Class of December 2020 on December 13, 2020. Welcome New Interim Dean

Dr. Susan Berger has been designated as interim dean of St. Joseph's College of Nursing. Dr. Berger has served on the College of Nursing Governing

Board for seven years. Before assuming the role of interim dean, she served since January 2021 as chair of the governing board. Dr. Berger's history with St. Joseph's Hospital dates to when she began her nursing career forty years ago as a registered nurse working in the Intensive Care Unit.

Dr. Berger earned Bachelor of Science and Master of Science degrees in Nursing from Syracuse University as well as a Doctorate in Education, with a concentration in Higher Education leadership from Fielding Graduate University. She has worked as a Nurse Practitioner at Syracuse University. At Cazenovia College, she served as Director of Health Services and later, for 15 years as Chief Operating Officer.

In a recent press release regarding Dr. Berger's appointment as interim dean Leslie Paul Luke, president and CEO of St. Joseph's Health is quoted to have said "Dr. Berger brings with her a wealth of management experience in higher education. We are confident that she will provide outstanding leadership and counsel to faculty, staff and students, while we continue the search for a permanent Dean."

Diversity Scholarship

The Diversity Scholarship has been established by St.

Joseph's College of Nursing's Alumni Association to support the need for continued education of Registered Professional Nurses from diverse backgrounds. The purpose of this scholarship is to provide financial support for continued education in nursing (and other specialties



as applicable) for a graduate of St. Joseph's College of Nursing from a diverse background; diverse backgrounds include but are not limited to areas of race, ethnicity, gender, culture, age, sexual orientation, gender expression, gender identity, and religion. A graduate of St. Joseph's College of Nursing from a diverse background who is pursuing an advanced degree such as a baccalaureate degree in nursing, master's degree in nursing, or doctoral degree in nursing or other specialty is eligible to apply. Additional eligibility requirements and criteria are specified on the Diversity Scholarship Application which will be posted soon on the St. Joseph's College of Nursing's website. The Diversity Scholarship is established from funds received from the late Hugh B. Hoeffler, M.D. who had established the Katherine Roach Hoeffler. Class of 1933 Memorial Award in memory of his wife. One Diversity Scholarship will be awarded on an annual basis. Completed applications and essays are to be submitted between October 1st and October 15th each year and must be sent via US mail (with a postmark no later than October 15th) to St. Joseph's College of Nursing's Alumni Association, 206 Prospect Ave, Syracuse, New York 13203.

The National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-RN®) is a nationwide examination for the licensing of nurses in the US and Canada. St. Joseph's College of Nursing graduates for December 2019 and May 2020 achieved a 91% overall year to date first-time pass rate, well above state and national means. Over 70% of the graduates from the Class of December 2019 and May 2020 had accepted positions at St. Joseph's Health Hospital.



The COVID-19 pandemic was unprecedented and impacted each of us differently. We asked our Alumni to share their nursing experiences during the pandemic:

"My role initially shifted from providing nursing care to students in person, to telephonic case management with parents/ guardians, and delivery of meals to families who were in need. Once students returned to hybrid learning, students provided nursing care as needed. We have also assisted the OCHD in following up with parents/guardians regarding COVID-19 symptoms or exposure, and where they should go for COVID-19 testing. We follow up on test results and advise parents/guardians of isolation or quarantine time frame."

"Significant stress by students related to unknown regarding their education and clinical abilities due to hospitals preventing them from being onsite."

"The needs of our community continue to be great during this pandemic. It is a great opportunity to work with nursing colleagues, public health professionals, and community leaders to help meet their needs."

"I saw a shift from our mainstay cardiac/stroke/cath lab patients to more med-surge patients, heavy on the medical care, I watched and felt a decrease in staff with an increase in patient load." "Despite being retired, I had been feeling like I needed to help somehow with the efforts to keep people in our community healthy. I knew I was no longer competent to keep pace with care in the hospital so delivering vaccines was a way to help. I was amazed at how grateful people were to receive the vaccine. I had numerous people thank me for "coming out of retirement". It was very comforting for me to know that I was able to help in such a small way."

"Nursing education has made dramatic shifts in learning since the pandemic began. Forcing face to face programs to go to distance learning has been challenging. Nursing skills and clinical experiences have been changed and in some cases, clinical all together unavailable. This pandemic has brought both good and uncertain changes to nursing education."

"Overworked and undervalued, destroyed my soul."

"I was thankful to be employed."

"With being a new nurse during a pandemic and a time of need it has been very difficult. I have seen things a new graduate would ever imagine. I couldn't have done it without my family, friends and coworkers. I am so thankful for this opportunity to help serve my community. I'm excited to be graduating with my BSN this May and continuing on with providing care to those in need. Please stay safe and healthy. God bless."

"Be flexible and embrace change!"

"I found that being on the front lines of testing and vaccination after being in an administrator position for many years was humbling. I truly appreciate the work that my fellow nurses do each and every day."

"Became skilled in telehealth and volunteered for county sponsored Covid vaccine clinics."

"I think this was very traumatic for many nurses and we need to be prepared for the loss of experience as many are choosing to leave based on what they experienced and went through."

"Significant increase in volume throughout the pandemic. Severe pandemic stress, several new patients in the healthcare field."

"The hardest part of screening ambulatory surgery patients is the restriction of a no visitor policy. Family members are at a loss not being able to support their loved one."

"People who never worked with Covid will never understand how us frontline nurses feel. I've never seen people who were so sick clinging to their life everyday. It feels like you are taking care of the same patient everyday. It's tiring and it makes you feel like there is no hope some days. It is hard seeing people suffer every day."

"Schools did not receive any guidance until 9/30/20 so it was very difficult to assure we were keeping everyone safe but we managed very well as a District."

"I felt my clinical experience at St. Joseph's was absolutely invaluable and I am extremely grateful for my class and instructors!"

"Being a new nurse during a pandemic was overwhelming to say the least. But it helped me learn to adjust quickly while providing the best patient care I knew how to. Working alongside coworkers both new and experienced was a blessing, we all leaned on each other for support and learned from one another every day. I would not have made it through without the help of my coworkers."

"As Nurse Team Leader for the Medical Suite at Helio Health Outpatient Services I am grateful to have served in role of education to both staff and patients of necessity of adhering consistently to best practices to minimize risks for all."

"Covid-19 is very real. The amount of patients I've seen struggling is so heartbreaking. What is even more devastating is that these patients and families are not able to be together. It really makes nursing that much more special to be able to provide love and care to those who desperately need it during such a very heart wrenching time for all."

"As a traveling RN, I was in a unique position to at first be involuntarily put on a covid floor mid assignment (as were most nurses regardless of role) but after that to be able to choose whether I wanted that type of assignment or not. I was fortunate to be able to take a break from the inpatient side of things and help in a different way - administering the vaccines. I said I wouldn't go back inpatient for a while, I was burnt out. But after administering vaccinations to healthcare professionals who's countless stories I heard of their experiences during COVID (both personal and professional) & how they were so grateful, finally feeling some sense of hope; this coupled with the continuing number of cases, I found myself taking another covid assignment, to hopefully lessen the burden on those who haven't had reprieve in almost a year."

"The Syracuse VA has been very diligent during the pandemic, we changed all outpatient primary care appointments to video or telephone and have only just recently just started seeing in-person visits, all go through a rigorous screening prior to entering the medical center."

"It has been a big change in practice for all, I remember thinking how long will we have to do this for, and thank goodness we are able to have family members at bedside unlike the adults. When I floated to adults I was humbled in the experience and was blown away at what the nurses have been doing for months. They were so grateful for the smallest thing I did to help. I was grateful for the experience and have volunteered multiple times after that. Now that kids are getting more sick because they are experiencing MIS-C, we are very busy and I value that job I have chosen everyday I walk into work. I am proud to be a nurse during this pandemic and more proud to be an alumni of St. Joseph's College of Nursing, I would not be here if it was not for the support and encouragement of the evening weekend educators and staff!"

"The pandemic put increased stress on the individual nurse. Often times we were taking care of more and sicker patients. The realities of the pandemic also highlighted the need of nurses, especially nurses at the bedside, to band together and advocate for the safety of themselves and their patients. The demands placed on hospitals directly affected nurses and, in many situations, led to nurses being stretched too thin."

"I hope to never see anything like Covid again in my lifetime."

"We will never be the same again- COVID has changed us. I'm worried we may not see the impact the unexpected pandemic had on us as healthcare providers for a couple years. I will never forget the way it felt in the early weeks: I didn't know if I was safe in my PPE or if I would be bringing home COVID to my family. The fear of bringing home COVID to my family was harder on me than wondering if I would get sick. I had a lot of trouble sleeping and the sounds of ambulances in my

neighborhood at night was difficult. It is so wonderful not to hear them as much anymore. The day I was vaccinated was a huge relief because I knew that if something happened and someone I loved got sick it wouldn't be all my fault and I was doing everything I could to protect them. It was one step closer to the light at the end of the tunnel and an end to this pandemic we felt like would be forever. I hope that everyone is doing self-care and asking for help if needed. I saw nurses step up and do everything they could during the crisis and the time following is very difficult. It is very hard to see nurses changing jobs with everything we have been through and leaving nursing all together. It is okay to prioritize your own mental health. We have done amazing work and the work we did the past year will change healthcare for the better forever. We saved lives and supported everyone we know in any way that we could!"

"I am proud to be a nurse and I am thankful to be a part of serving our community in this difficult time."

"Most trying and emotional time of my nursing career."

"Working all day in a mask took some getting used to. I would rather teach in person – online teaching is exhausting and students are trying to stay engaged but virtual school is hard on them."

"Very difficult to cut to core team of 10 personnel total due to low volume of cases for 60 days."


"I truly appreciate my nursing colleagues during this pandemic!"

"The pandemic changed the way in which we provided care. Most of our patient visits were done by telephone or virtually. We had additional duties to support the pandemic such as swabbing and screening for Covid-19 and giving/offering the vaccine as soon as it was available. We had to work together and some days were harder than others especially when we were short staffed due to illness or nurses detailed for Covid operations. This certainly brought us together because there just was no way possible to do it alone."

"I have been busy at home making cloth masks designed by a sewing teacher in Arlington who has a group of seamstresses in the area who make masks and scrub caps since the pandemic started. She provides all the supplies (pre-cut material etc.) in a kit that we sew and return to her. She DONATES all the masks and scrub caps FREE to senior housing, hospitals, long-term care facilities or ANYONE who knocks on her door and needs a mask or two, she gives them free. I have a nurse friend who was Director of Nursing at a long-term care facility who was in need of 100 scrub caps for the employees; she filled a grocery bag (no questions asked) for FREE! Laura is an amazing person; always cheerful and smiling – Laura's tally is 9,500 to-date. My humble contribution is 750 masks plus 270 scrub caps and "counting". Needless to say I love to sew!"

"This has been the most challenging time in my career as an RN."

"Thanks to all who worked so hard and for such long hours under unimaginable conditions. You were true angels of mercy."



In Memory of Ellen Schaub Meyer

Marianne Markowitz Retirement

Marianne Markowitz, EdD, MS, RN, CNE retired as Vice President and Dean of St. Joseph's College

of Nursing on Jan 1, 2021. This marked the end of a 30-plus vear career at the helm of the CON.

Marianne actually began her career at St. Joseph's while she was in high school. Her mom, Rita Cole, worked in St. Joseph's medical records, and Marianne worked in that department for a time before nursing school. Dr. Markowitz graduated from St. Joseph's nursing school in Elmira, NY and then attended SUNY College of Technology at Utica-Rome. While studying in the Mohawk Valley region, Marianne worked at Little Falls Hospital and St. Luke's Hospital. After earning her BS degree, Marianne found her way eventually to St. Elizabeth's Hospital in Utica, first as a staff nurse and eventually in a faculty role at St. Elizabeth's College of Nursing. Marianne had a variety of roles over her time at St. Elizabeth's nursing school, and earned a master's in nursing from Syracuse University while living in Utica as well. By then Marianne had married George Markowitz and she had 2 children, Kevin and Sarah (College of Nursing grad, 2010).

One day in 1990, Marianne's mom noticed St. Joseph's in Syracuse was looking to hire an assistant director for the nursing school, and Marianne applied. Sister Geraldine DeLuca, the director at the time, had the good sense to hire Marianne, and the rest is history. Over time, Sister Geraldine moved on to other assignments, and Marianne became Director, then Dean and Vice President of St. Joseph's College of Nursing.

Marianne guided the College of Nursing through the initial implementation and expansion of computerization, to and through virtual/on-line learning in the time of the Coronavirus pandemic. Looking back, Marianne is very pleased to have been a trail-blazer with regard to overseeing the development of the weekend program, which morphed into the evening -weekend program in recent years. Not to be forgotten is the start of the dual degree program in nursing, in cooperation with Dr. Susan Bastable and LeMoyne College. This program eventually and successfully expanded to include dual-degree /second-degree students. Along the way, Marianne earned an EdD from St. John Fisher College.

Other changes and accomplishments at St. Joseph's during Dr Markowitz's tenue included accreditation by Middle States Commission on Higher Education (MSCHE), followed by accreditation by the Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN), and designation of the College of Nursing as a Center of Excellence by the National League for Nursing (NLN). The renovation of the 6th floor of the College of Nursing into modernized study and hang-out space for students was accomplished around 2016. Dr Markowitz received the Sr. Patricia Ann Lifetime Achievement Award from St. Joseph's Hospital in 2018.

Reflecting on her years with St. Joseph's, Marianne says she misses the faculty and students, she especially enjoyed seeing the students succeed.

As for current and future plans, Marianne and her husband George have a trip planned out west in Spring '21 to see son Kevin and visit some national parks. Professionally Marianne is doing some work for the Accreditation Commission in Nursing Education (ACEN) on-line, as well as doing some teaching and consulting in nursing education management.

Due to the pandemic, there was no formal celebration of Marianne's retirement. Instead, contributions are requested to a scholarship in her honor.
