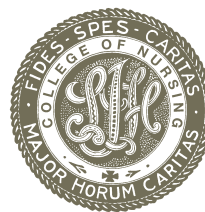

Founded: 1898 by the Sisters of St. Francis

Degrees granted: Associate's degree in applied science with a major in nursing (bachelor's degree with a major in nursing granted by Le Moyne College to students completing the Accelerated and Dual Degree Partnerships)

Application deadline: Rolling with the following target dates:

- Weekday – Jan. 1
- Evening/Weekend – Sept. 1
- ADDPN/DDPN – Refer to Le Moyne College website www.lemoyne.edu/nursing

Accreditations: Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (St. Joseph's College of Nursing), Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (Le Moyne College) and Middle States Commission on Higher Education (both colleges)

Educational facilities: Clinical learning simulation lab and nursing library (3,000 volumes and 1,200 print and electronic journals and newsletters)

Enrollment: 275-315

Student life: Coed residence hall, special interest support groups, wellness programs, bus trips, discounted tickets to local entertainment, chapel, athletic center (at Le Moyne College)

Applying to St. Joseph's

Admission to St. Joseph's is competitive. Applicants must have minimally earned the following:

- High school diploma or equivalent (GED) and rank in upper half of graduating class
- Competitive SAT and/or ACT scores (recent high school students/graduates only)
- Completion of and a passing grade in algebra, biology and chemistry at the high school (New York State Regents preferred) or college level
- Completed application and essay
- Official transcripts from all high schools and/or colleges attended
- Two completed recommendation forms from teachers, counselors or employers
- Successful personal interview

Special Requirements

- Applicants to the Accelerated and Dual Degree Partnerships must apply to Le Moyne College. A Joint Admission Committee from St. Joseph's College of Nursing and Le Moyne College reviews applications and selects students who will be offered a place in the ADDPN or DDPN.

- Applicants to the Evening/Weekend option are encouraged, but not required, to complete credits in the humanities and sciences prior to enrollment, as only the Nursing (NSG) courses are offered in this option. See the college's catalog online for more details.
