Meet the New Deans



Dr. Lenore Boris

Dr. Lenore Boris became the Dean of St. Joseph's College of Nursing in the fall of 2021, replacing Dr. Susan Berger (Interim Dean). Dr. Boris has years of clinical and managerial experience in higher education, most recently serving as the Associate Dean at the Binghamton regional campus of the

Upstate Medical University College of Medicine for over fifteen years. Dr. Boris retired as a Colonel in the United States Air Force (including time in the Air Force Reserve) after 28 years of service. She also served as a flight nurse during Desert Storm and Operation Enduring Freedom.

Dr. Boris' education includes an undergraduate degree in education and Baccalaureate of Science in Nursing (BSN) degree from California State University/ Hayward, a Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) from Syracuse University, and a Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) and a law degree (J.D.) from the University of Wisconsin. Dr. Boris' clinical experience includes medical-surgical, labor and delivery, and post-partum nursing in acute care hospitals. She also was involved in establishing a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN) education program in the Albany area. Dr. Boris mentioned she had "one foot in retirement" when the opportunity to interview for her current position arose. Dr Boris says she thinks the job is a good fit, based on her wealth of related experience.

She enjoys walking and hiking, home projects, and visiting family and friends when she has the opportunity. She resides in Ithaca with her son Aaron and her elderly cat.



Dr. Kara E. Evans

Dr. Kara E. Evans became an Associate Dean at St Joseph's College of Nursing in the spring of 2022. Dr. Evans is a graduate of St Joseph's College of Nursing (2002). She earned a Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) degree from Keuka College (2005), a Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) degree

from Le Moyne College (2009), and a Doctor of Philosophy in Nursing Education (Ph.D.) degree from Capella University (2018). Kara's nursing experience includes working as a staff nurse in the surgical intensive care unit (SICU), a staff educator, and a manager on unit 2-8 at St. Joseph's Hospital Health Center. Diversity Scholarship

The Diversity Scholarship was established in 2021 by St. Joseph's College of Nursing's Alumni Association to support the need for continued education of Registered Professional Nurses from diverse backgrounds. The purpose of this scholarship is to provide financial support for continued education in nursing (and other specialties as applicable) for a graduate of St. Joseph's College of Nursing from a diverse background; diverse backgrounds include but are not limited to areas of race, ethnicity, gender, culture, age, sexual orientation, gender expression, gender identity, and religion. A graduate of St. Joseph's College of Nursing from a diverse background who is pursuing an advanced degree such as a baccalaureate degree in nursing, master's degree in nursing, or doctoral degree in nursing or other specialty is eligible to apply. Additional eligibility requirements and criteria are specified on the Diversity Scholarship Application which is posted on the St. Joseph's College of Nursing's website. The Diversity Scholarship is established from funds received from the late Hugh B. Hoeffler, M.D. who had established the Katherine Roach Hoeffler, Class of 1933 Memorial Award in memory of his wife. One Diversity Scholarship will be awarded on an annual basis. Completed applications and essays are to be submitted between October 1st and October 15th each year and must be sent via US mail (with a postmark no later than October 15th) to St. Joseph's College of Nursing's Alumni Association, 206 Prospect Ave, Syracuse, New York 13203.

First-Time Pass Rate & Employment at St. Joseph's Health Hospital

The National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-RN®) is a nationwide examination for the licensing of nurses in the US and Canada. St. Joseph's College of Nursing graduates for December 2020 and May 2021 achieved an 87% overall year to date first-time pass rate, well above state and national means. Over 65% of the graduates from the Class of December 2020 and the Class of May 2021 had accepted positions at St. Joseph's Health Hospital.

Endowed Fund for the Alumni Association

An endowed fund has been established in early 2022 for the Alumni Association through St. Joseph's Health Foundation. This new Alumni Association endowed fund will support the college in the future by providing financial assistance and making grants to St. Joseph's College of Nursing for its purposes by but not limited to supporting capital projects, operations, and nursing student and graduate scholarships. The St. Joseph's College of Nursing Meccariello Center for Experiential Learning was designed to allow nursing students to practice assessments and skills within a realistic hospital environment. Our state-of-the-art facility features simulation rooms furnished with medical equipment and high-fidelity simulation mannequins. The Experiential Learning Leaders Dorothy Kowalczyk MA, RN (Weekday Program) and Emily Porter MS, RN, CMSRN (Evening-Weekend Program) were interviewed regarding updates in the laboratory. They explained the program teaches nursing assessments and skills in addition to interactive labs, case studies, and immersive simulations throughout the curriculum. "We are trying to focus on critical thinking, clinical judgment, not just the skills," Dorothy Kowalczyk explained. Simulation impacts students' clinical practice and preparation for entry into the nursing profession. "High-fidelity simulations help students to have more confidence in their skills. It helps them develop more independence in the charge nurse role and develop their delegation skills," said Emily Porter. They described recent initiatives, including creating a mock pyxis (computerized electronic medication cabinet) and clean utility room to expose students to equipment used in the hospital. The college also recently purchased two female simulation mannequins of diverse ethnic background. These updates in the Meccariello Center for Experiential Learning are evidence of creating an innovative and inclusive learning environment at St. Joseph's College of Nursing. Over the years, a number of generous alumni have graciously contributed financially to helping the college procure state-of-the art equipment, including various ethnically-diverse simulation apparatus. Research Grant Article

St. Joseph's College of Nursing received a grant from Sentinel U to study the impact of virtual reality simulation on nursing students' confidence in clinical judgment and prioritization. The Sentinel U Prioritization of Care Qualitative Research Study was performed in April-May 2022. Faculty investigators (pictured left to right) included Stephen Stewart MS, RN, CNE-cl, Amanda Brigandi MS, RN, CWOCN (alumni, class of '12), Patricia Spoto Ed.D., RN, CMS (alumni, class of '08), Jennifer Cerio MS, RN, CNE (alumni, class of '07), Emily Porter MS, RN, CMSRN (alumni, class of '16), Kelly Ward MS, RN, CCRN (alumni, class of '07), and Aida Gahan-Benson MS, RN, CLC. A group of students participated in virtual simulations while classmates experienced the standard simulations. Using surveys and focus groups, faculty investigators participated in the internal review board application, informed consent, and qualitative data collection. Faculty investigators plan to spend the summer analyzing the research data and writing for publication. The findings of the study will provide insight into the value of using virtual simulations.

Nursing Pin Donation Center Update



The Nursing Pin Donation Center was established in 2019 since it is no longer possible to purchase St. Joseph's Hospital Health Center School of Nursing pins (due to the name change several years ago to St. Joseph's College of Nursing at St. Joseph's Hospital Health Center). The pin donation center provides working graduates who have lost their original

School of Nursing pin and who have requested a replacement pin (when available) with one that has been generously donated by one of our Alumni. Since establishment of the Pin Donation Center, six alumnae have generously donated their nursing pins. The Saint Marianne Cope Scholarship

The Saint Marianne Cope Scholarship was established in loving memory of Saint Marianne Cope, honored for her kind and courageous work with the leper colony on the island of Molokai in Hawaii. She is close to us as she was the administrator of Saint Joseph's Hospital beginning in 1883. Later, she traveled to Hawaii to assist Father Damien (now Saint Damien) with his devoted service to the leprosy patients in exile on Kalaupapa, Molokai. The epidemic of leprosy was terrifying at the time and Mother Marianne and six sisters who accompanied her spent the remainder of their lives living with, and devoted to, those who contracted it. Mother Marianne was canonized as a saint in the Catholic Church in 2012 and is known as the "Mother of Outcasts." Saint Joseph's College of Nursing is graced by her kindness. The scholarship is funded by Karen (Vogel) Osborne, a 1969 graduate of Saint Joseph's Hospital School of Nursing and a relative of Saint Marianne, to remind us of the love behind all of our work.

The Saint Marianne Cope Scholarship was established in October 2021 and is presented on an annual basis to one or two incoming St. Joseph's College of Nursing students.

The recipient of this scholarship will:

- 1. Be a student who has submitted a scholarship application;
- 2. Demonstrate academic excellence in high school or previous college;
- 3. Demonstrate financial need; and
- 4. Have a need for indirect costs such as childcare, rent, food, etc. in order to focus on their studies.

This scholarship can be awarded to a student from any level who has already been awarded a scholarship but still has financial difficulty with indirect costs. St. Joseph's College of Nursing is grateful to Karen (Vogel) Osborne for establishing this scholarship in memory of Saint Marianne Cope.
