## St. Joseph's College of Nursing Building our Endowment to Support the Future of Nursing

St. Joseph's College of Nursing celebrated its 125th Anniversary on October 1st, 2023. As part of its 125th Anniversary, we held our annual reunion the weekend of October 7th and 8th. It was a pleasure to see and meet alums from all over the country in celebration of this milestone. Through many conversations over the weekend, the overall sentiment was that while the mission of Nursing continues to remain the same, there have certainly been changes along the way, primarily with the cost of education and tuition at Nursing Schools throughout the county.

We need your support now more than ever! The United States is experiencing the most significant nursing shortage ever faced. To address this pressing need, we are looking to attract a diverse mix of nursing students, including those who express financial need. In conjunction with the College's 125th Anniversary, we have embarked on a campaign to raise \$1.25 million by the end of 2024. The money raised will provide partial and full-tuition scholarships to prospective College of Nursing students.

As a result of a generous bequest received in 2010 from an alum of St. Joseph's College of Nursing, all contributions of \$125 or more will be 100% matched. Donations that qualify for the match are as follows:

- 1. Any contribution of \$125 or more to the College of Nursing Governing Board Advised Fund.
- 2. Donors can endow their funds by contributing \$12,500 to endow a named scholarship.
- 3. Donors with an endowed scholarship from the College of Nursing can add to their existing fund.

As of December 2023, about \$800,00 has been raised. The hope is to meet the 1.25 million target by the end of 2024.

We ask that you please consider supporting St. Joseph's College of Nursing's 125th Anniversary Campaign in this defining moment in the history of health care. Your gift will immediately impact the lives of our nursing students and the patients who will receive their care.

#### **Alumni Diversity Scholarship**

The Diversity Scholarship was established in 2021 by St. Joseph's College of Nursing's Alumni Association to support the need for continued education of Registered Professional Nurses from diverse backgrounds. The purpose of this scholarship is to provide financial support for continued education in nursing (and other specialties as applicable) for a graduate of St. Joseph's College of Nursing from a diverse background; diverse backgrounds include but are not limited to areas of race, ethnicity, gender, culture, age, sexual orientation, gender expression, gender identity, and religion. A graduate of St. Joseph's College of Nursing from a diverse background who is pursuing an advanced degree such as a baccalaureate degree in nursing, master's degree in nursing, or doctoral degree in nursing or other specialty is eligible to apply. Additional eligibility requirements and criteria are specified on the Diversity Scholarship Application which is posted on the St. Joseph's College of Nursing's website. The Diversity Scholarship is established from funds received from the late Hugh B. Hoeffler, M.D. who had established the Katherine Roach Hoeffler, Class of 1933 Memorial Award in memory of his wife. One Diversity Scholarship will be awarded on an annual basis. The application can be found online at the alumni section of the CON website. Application will need to be downloaded and printed, and mailed-in.

The Plant Sale was a success for the December 2023 holiday season. Alumni volunteers and chairperson Trish Masterpol '11 staffed the sale in the hospital lobby. All proceeds benefit the Alumni Association that supports the College of Nursing.

#### **Underwear: A Basic Need**





The Alumni Association held a successful drive to address a basic need of local children in poverty. In Syracuse, NY, where childhood poverty rates are high, the Alumni Association took a step to address a fundamental need often overlooked – underwear for school-age children. In a recent drive, the association collected 1551 pairs of new underwear items to benefit children receiving care within the St. Joseph's Health network.

The initiative aimed to tackle an often-unnoticed issue: children attending school without undergarments due to financial constraints. While underwear might seem inconspicuous, studies reveal that children facing this predicament tend to perform poorly in school, experiencing shame, lower self-esteem, and distraction.

On Monday, December 11, 2023, the donated underwear was delivered to St. Joseph's Health Primary Care Center - West, marking a successful effort to support the well-being of local children. The generosity of all those who donated is not just about providing a basic necessity but also about fostering an environment where children can focus on their education without the burden of shame.

The Alumni Association thanks all who donated. This initiative reflects the community's commitment to addressing overlooked needs, emphasizing the importance of collective efforts to positively impact the lives of children living in poverty.

## First-time NCLEX Pass rate and employment of graduates by St Joseph's:

The National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-RN®) is a nationwide examination for licensing nurses in the US and Canada. St. Joseph's College of Nursing graduates in 2023 year-to-date had a pass rate of 88.7% for first-time test-takers.

Over 73% of the graduates from the most recent five graduating classes accepted positions at St. Joseph's Health Hospital.

#### **New January Cohort**

In January 2024, St Joseph's College of Nursing will welcome a first-semester day program cohort. This is a change; up until now, the day program only admitted a class in the fall semester. Becky Baroody, St. Joseph's' College of Nursing Admissions and Enrollment Coordinator, stated the spring option has many benefits. Firstly, this will increase the starting dates to three times per year rather than two, which in turn offers the opportunity for expanding enrollment. Secondly, recent high school graduates can benefit from completing certain general education requirements toward the associate degree during the fall semester. It is strongly advised for applicants to complete the Anatomy and Physiology I & II course before joining our program. This course is considered one of the most difficult, and very helpful in preparing students for learning the material in the nursing program. Thirdly, it will help applicants start the program more quickly than usual. Lastly, it can help current students who may not pass a course. Instead of waiting for a year, they can repeat the course immediately. Following this trial, it is hoped that, with sufficient faculty and clinical sites, this can continue.

Applications for the Evening/Weekend cohort starting in July 2025 and the Weekday cohort starting in August 2024 are currently being accepted. To start the application process, head to the SJCON website home page at www.sjhcon.edu.

#### The Nursing Pin Donation Center

The center was established in 2019 since it is no longer possible to purchase St. Joseph's Hospital Health Center School of Nursing pins (due to the name change several years ago to St. Joseph's College of Nursing at St. Joseph's Hospital Health Center). The pin donation center provides working graduates who have lost their original School of Nursing pin and who have requested a replacement pin (when available) with one that has been generously donated by one of our Alumni. Since the Pin Donation Center was established, six alumnae have generously donated their nursing pins. Graduates receiving a donated nursing pin are encouraged to donate to St. Joseph's College of Nursing at St. Joseph's Hospital Health Center.
